SPECIAL EXHIBITION: The Gage Brewer Guitar – First Electric Guitar

Wichita occupies a special place in guitar history. It is recognized as the city where the electric guitar made its world debut in 1932.

The Museum celebrates National Electric Guitar Day (Nov. 27) throughout November with the special exhibition of the first electric guitar, introduced to the world from Wichita in 1932. The guitar, a Rickenbacker Electro Spanish prototype, was one of two used by Gage Brewer who brought them directly to Wichita from Los Angeles for a sensational introduction in October of 1932. The guitar, on loan to the Museum, is featured in numerous books and articles published worldwide and has been exhibited recently at the Musical Instrument Museum and the Eiteljorg Museum.

The Wichita-Sedgwick County Historical Museum has taken the initiative to collect electric guitars with local historical connections including the electric guitars of notable local musicians including the electric guitars of: Bill Goffrier, Berry Harris, Ralph Krenzer (Sammy Hart), Clif Major, Pat McJimsey, Henry Walker, Marce Reyes, Shark Shelton, Bud Victory, Joe Walsh, Bob Wiley, and Johnny Western.

The Wichita-Sedgwick County Historical Museum is one of America's leading local history museums and accredited by the American Alliance of Museum since 1972. It has served the community since 1939 and since 1980 has occupied Wichita's original 1890 City Hall building, a National Historic Landmark featuring dozens of exhibits on all four floors.
