**About “Let’s Talk Shop”**

Sisters and award-winning filmmakers, Sara and Charity Harmon, tell the history of Wichita’s two biggest department stores: Innes and Henry’s. Though these stores no longer exist, the former buildings are being repurposed for higher education.

**About WeHarmonSisters:**

Sara and Charity Harmon, known as “WeHarmonSisters,” are award-winning Wichita filmmakers. Their films include *For Your Amusement*, *Who Scammed Rajah Rabbit?*, and their latest, *Let’s Talk Shop*.
